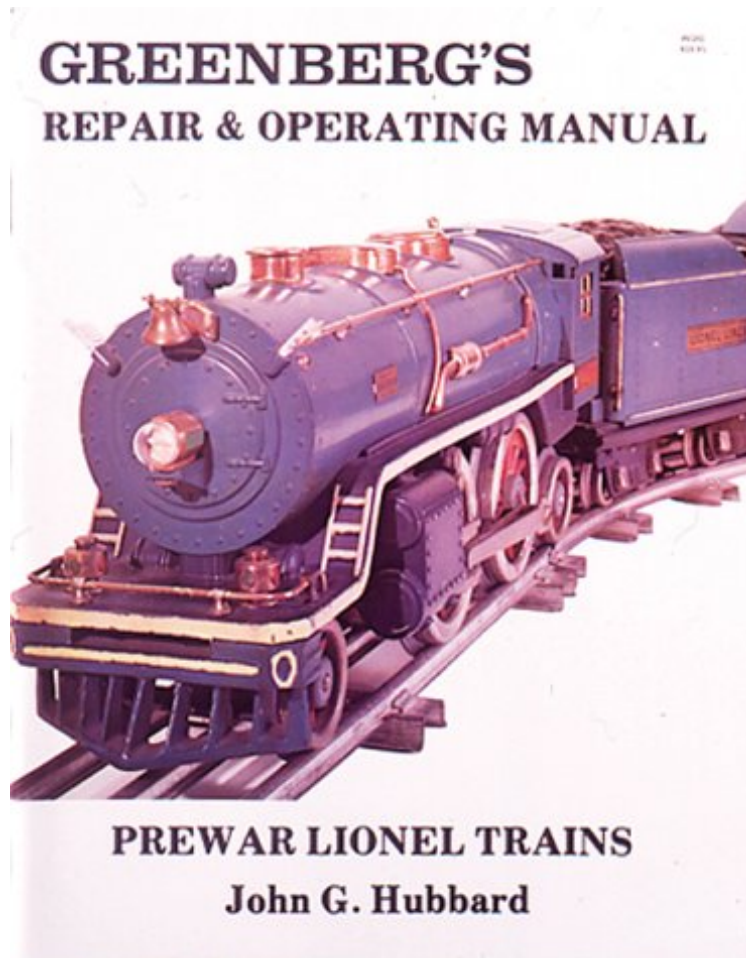

Aside from some very old and out-dated methods of repairing cracked frames and other generalized repairs, there is little to nothing in the way of wiring schematics or physical diagrams for re-wiring specific locomotives. In this booklet you will find the common general diagram that you can find anywhere on the internet about what pathways the DC current travels, the matrix of the

barrel style "modern" E-unit, but that's about it. If you think you are going to open this booklet and find a wiring diagram for a 1928 253E with a pendulum reverse and a type VIII motor you can forget it! A little Yankee Ingenuity goes a long way. I had to tear apart a pendulum E-unit to find where the wires to the coil came from and went as well as how the matrix of the switch actually performed. And I photographed it all for you. p.s. the same motor and E-unit are in other Locomotives like the 260E. This is a very expensive book...why?...I don't know but I paid a whole lot less for mine and I was STILL disappointed. Again, and I repeat, you will not find and motor "types" categorized with exploded views and wiring, you will not find any truck "types" for rolling stock. It's 75 pages of very old-fashioned epoxy and solder repairs and pages 76-95 are how to put the "Kit Hudson" Lionel sold, together. 6 of 6 people found the following review helpful. I have been able to perform many restorations of pre-war trains and accessories using the advice and diagrams of this book. The subjects are separated by chapters that deal with the reasons, mechanic's and instructions of equipment operation. You get a real sense for the hobby as it existed prior to World War II. The diagrams are remarkably clear with supplemental new text along side of the original operating diagrams. This makes for much easier reading. Of special interest is the chapter on the assembly of the Lionel 700E kit. This section is a treasure of diagrams, pictures and assembly procedures for this famous Hudson.
